Ladislaus M. Pákozdy is Professor of Biblical Theology and General History of Religion at the Reformed Theological Faculty of the University of Debrecen (Hungary).

Quentin M. Nelson is a missionary under the Swedish Covenant Church working in the Ubangi region of northwest Congo.
