

Adviser, and for five years gave himself to this work with considerable skill and success. It was during this period that the foundations of the Translations Department of the Bible Society of India were well and truly laid, and the way prepared for the appointment of the first full-time Translations Secretary, the Rev. Chrysostom Arangaden.

For Mr Culshaw, however, this was but the end of a chapter, for he proceeded to Australia where, under the auspices of the B.F.B.S., he was asked to undertake the founding of a similar Translations Department to deal with the languages of Oceania. In all these areas he has travelled widely and familiarized himself with the problems of translators and advisers. He has proved himself a wise and competent guide, and a capable administrator. We may be sure that in his hands the new duties and responsibilities which now come to him will be most capably carried out, and we welcome his appointment as a milestone in the development of the United Bible Societies. The July number of *The Bible Translator* will be the first major responsibility in his new office, but a sample of his writing is included in the current number, in an article on 'Pacific Scripture Translation—A New Phase'.
